# Beneath the Spire...

Last week during our Sunday School gathering the Mission Ministry Team proposed their hope to have 100% congregational engagement in this year's mission ministry programs. As a church who seeks to be more missionally involved this is the initiative we ought to have; it calls on us as a church to *be* the church. This initiative makes a statement - a statement that our congregation is about mission, that we as a church gather together to grow in Christ and that involves serving Christ, serving God's children and working to build up the kingdom of God. It is a great statement to make, that our whole church – not just a group of our church, a certain age demographic, a certain social demographic, or certain ministry teams but rather our whole church is engaged in the mission of this church.

While this is a statement to make about who we are as a church, this is also a call. It is a way for our church to "grow together." As we seek to be a church that grows together - growing in spirituality, faith and discipleship, mission is a wonderful way to do that. When we serve together in mission, we build relationships - relationships that affect who we are, how we understand the world, how we enjoy one another, how we serve Christ, and how we relate to Christ. And when we serve together, serving Christ by serving our neighbors, we grow closer to Christ, seeing Christ in new ways and recognizing our faith in action. Our relationships with those we serve with from our congregation and those we serve with in the community are vital to the life of our discipleship.

As we serve together - I believe we grow together - growing as we see new gifts and talents and passions of our brothers and sisters in the church emerge and as we learn about these gifts that God has given us. We grow together as we see one another serve, opening ourselves to the ways Jesus is at work in our midst. We grow together as a body of Christ as we work, the hard *hard* work, of building up the kingdom of God. We grow together by serving Christ, by laying down our needs and burdens at the feet of Christ and picking up the call to greater discipleship in Christ.

We ask that you prayerfully consider the ways you may get involved in mission ministry at Trinity. The mission ministry team has worked diligently to identify ways for every member to support these ministries - through monetary gifts, gifts of time, gifts of relationship and gifts of kindness. Similarly, consider your own God given gifts and talents and the ways they may be of use in avenues that we have not yet discovered. Help us to reach our goal of 100% congregational engagement in mission ministries, to help us grow together as a community of faith that serves Christ and serves its neighbors.


## Glory to God Hymnal Drive

# Jim Calder Presbytery of Charlotte 2016 Outstanding Older Adult



When asked to summarize his activities since retirement, long-time Trinity member Jim Calder simply responds that he steps in "whenever anything needs doing." That is, of course, a major understatement. Currently he is serving a second term on Session since his retirement, making a total of six terms. He has been Clerk of Session and repeatedly chaired the Buildings and Grounds and Stewardship Committees. When not on Session, he remains active on ministry teams, such as the Pastor Nominating Committee and Long Range Planning Committee. Jim was a commissioner to the General Assembly.

Church is not Jim's only ministry. As a Rotarian, he has been President, board member and committee chair of the Providence Rotary Club, which named him Distinguished Rotarian. He was Lt. Governor of District 7680. One highlight of his Rotary Club experience was a mission trip to Peru. As a member of Trinity's Habitat for Humanity siding crew, Jim was on Habitat's board. He is still active with Habitat.

The church houses the Shepherd's Center, thanks in part to Jim's efforts. Jim was recently featured in an article in the *Charlotte Observer* about the programs and services to the elderly offered by Shepherd's Center. As a board member and the main handyman, Jim works to keep senior citizens independent in their homes by performing simple home repairs, or more complicated ones such as adding a safe porch railing...just doing what needs doing.

Jim is not one to shy away from challenging assignments. Currently Jim is a member of the Mecklenburg County Board of Equalization and Review. This board is the first stop for a taxpayer who cannot resolve a dispute with the county assessor over a property tax assessment or exemption.

Jim and his wife Ruth Ann now call Sharon Towers their home. The choice of retirement communities was natural, since Jim is a former chair of the Board of Directors there. Whatever is going on at Trinity, in the community or at Sharon Towers, both Jim and Ruth Ann Calder are front and center, humbly making life better for those around them... doing what needs to be done.

## **IMPACT STORY - Kit Sluder**

Congregation members share an "Impact Story" during the worship service at least monthly. Please find below Kit Sluder's story shared November 15, 2015.

Good morning. I am standing up by the way. So, I was asked to give my impact story on Trinity and in the number of years I have been here there are, of course, a number of stories so I could stay up here for a week but I am just going to try and keep it simple.

Impact, to me, implies force, yet this is a story about years of God's unwearied and persistent show of love and teaching that found its way into my heart and mind through this place. Oddly enough it began right there where I was baptized. Thank you for the prop by the way.

In that moment the people of this church made a promise and that promise has been honored in countless ways over the years. As I grew there was always a place for me.

Even in Kindergarten I was at Trinity and I still miss that merry-go-round. My family had its pew and I remember looking way up to the pulpit which was filled with the presence of Dr. Patrick and at that time wondering if he would ever stop talking so we could get this done and get outside to play. With every pause I hoped, only to be disappointed as it was just a pause allowing for something said to sink in. But then I grew.

In those days of getting chided for giggling with May Johnston transformed into realizing there must be a reason that all the adults seemed to be enthralled with what was being said. And indeed there was a reason.

I began to pay attention.

In retrospect I realize he never once said this is what you

must believe. Instead he laid out scripture, beside literature, beside anecdote. He related the word of God to life thus my faith became my own. The Lord used what was taught to enter my soul and I was taught to think and the Lord allowed me to believe. I became truly committed, never forced. This place taught me to be open and willing.

As I became an adult Trinity continued to influence me and teach me and love me. When I was led to serve in Africa for a time, I was supported in every way by this incredible family. I found myself up here again, right there, being consecrated by the Reverend Gene Owens. Your kindness and your prayers sustained me through two trips of several months each and returning the second time you embraced me through a trial of trauma that I endured. It was never forced. It was the quiet enduring love of God shown through you in countless ways that allowed me to feel safe again.


Love seeps in where there is only darkness and slowly brings light. This church does that for people all the time and it happens whether we know it or not and that's probably a good thing. It is not because the Lord uses Trinity in ways that we may be completely unaware of. The people of Trinity are always learning, always growing, always serving, never forced, only open, only loving. God takes care of the rest.

It has undoubtedly been true in my life and I will forever be grateful for all the ways that God has been shown to me in and through this place, my church, Trinity.


