
On October 2, join us for a day of discipleship - to act in love, faith, and gratitude.

IMPACT STORY - Peter Devlin

Congregation members share an "Impact Story" during the worship service at least monthly. Please find below Peter Devlin's story shared May 29, 2016.

I have always thought if you do not believe in God you are just not listening.

I was born Roman Catholic. I was born in a Catholic hospital, baptized in a Catholic church and started off life going to a parochial school where I was taught that if I did not go to a Catholic church every Sunday I was committing a mortal sin. And if I died before I went to confession I was going straight to hell. What could I tell you, it was the 1950's.

I started going to year-round boarding school at the age of eight. The great thing about going to boarding schools is that it taught you independence; the sad thing is that you felt you had no home.

After graduating prep school, I went into the army. After I got out of the army I moved back to my father's house. I had gone to all boy schools and served in a mostly male army. At the age of 22 I did not have a lot of experience with women.

A friend fixed me up on a few blind dates but they all ended in disaster. Whenever I was driving alone I would have a conversation with God: his answers were not always very obvious. Driving home after another disastrous date I looked up and said, "What now, God?" My answer came a few days later. My father had a friend, who I did not know, who had a son, Don, who I did not know. Don was going into the army and my dad asked if I would talk to Don. So I took Don out to lunch and we talked for about three hours, after which Don told me he was having a going away party and would I come. At first I said no, because I did not know him or any of his friends. I relented because I didn't have He insisted. anything better to do. On the way driving over, I asked God, "How do you start a conversation with a girl?" Little did I know that at the party there were two girls, Joan and Elise, and there was a young man pestering Elise, quite insistently trying to get a date with her. Joan told the boy that, "Elise could not go on a date with him because Elise's fiancé was coming soon." The boy asked, "When?" And with that, I walked through the door. This perfect stranger walks up to me, grabs me by the arm and says, "This is Elise's fiancé now." That's how I met my wife. We've been happily married almost 40 years. I was listening and God was not being subtle.

We got married in a Catholic church, my children were raised Catholic, but I never felt at home in a Catholic church. When I was 50 I had drifted away from the church. Driving home, I would pass St. Gabe's, one of the churches I had gone to, and I would feel guilty about not going to church anymore. Because of what the priests and nuns had taught me as a child going to a non-Catholic church was out of the question. So after almost ten years of not going to church, I was having one of my normal conversations with God and I said, "What do I do?" Sometime later I got my answer. My son, who lives in Austin, TX, came home for a visit. He announced he's now a Presbyterian and would I like to go to church with him on Sunday. I agreed, and found online a Presbyterian church, right across the street from St. Gabe's. We go to church and immediately after service, as the congregation was starting to leave, the man in front of me turns around and says, "I don't believe we've met. My name is Bob Lyons." We talked for a few minutes and he said I should go to the after-service coffee. So I was walking towards the coffee and another man turns around and says. "I don't believe we've met. My name is Bruce *Voorheis.*" *I finally make it to the coffee and one by* one some ten people came up to me and each one of them says, "I don't believe I know you," and they introduce themselves. It was God saying to me, "Here is where you belong." I think God over rules a priest.

So to the choir I say, "You sing like angels. The music is beautiful and I love it. But you are not why I am here." And to Steve, "Your sermons are fascinating and up-lifting, but you're not why I am here." And to you, the congregation, I say, "The reason I am here is because of you, the congregation. You made me feel welcome on the first day. You invited me back into my home. Thank you."

Session Highlights

Stated Session Meeting on August 21, 2016:

Approved dissolving the Discernment Process Study Group with Session's appreciation.

Approved adopting the following marriage policy:

The Presbyterian Church (USA) has adopted the following definition of marriage: "Marriage is a gift God has given to all humankind for the well being of the entire human family. Marriage involves a unique commitment between two people, traditionally a man and a woman, to love and support each other for the rest of their lives. The sacrificial love that unites the couple sustains them as faithful and responsible members of the church and the wider community."

The session of Trinity Presbyterian Church hereby aligns Trinity with the Presbyterian Church (USA) in its definition of marriage. The service of Christian marriage at Trinity shall be available to any couple seeking marriage with no consideration of race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, or disability. The session continues to affirm the right of pastors to exercise their conscience with regard to whom they will marry and their responsibility to ensure that couples wishing to be married are appropriately prepared to undertake the vocation, responsibilities and privilege of marriage.




