# **Trinity's Sanctuary Updates**



At the end of April, work commenced on Phase 2 of the upgrades to our Sanctuary's A/V system. Phase 1 involved the installation of four cameras so our services can be broadcast online indefinitely. Phase 2 focuses on sound upgrades for those worshipping in person. Four column speakers have been installed on columns at the front and side of the Sanctuary. These speakers are the same color as the columns and blend in nicely. In addition, a "loop system" is being installed to benefit those with hearing aids equipped with T-Coil technology. We have plans to shorten four pews and create handicapped spaces for those in wheelchairs. There is a lot happening - we can't wait for you to see the changes!

Since the announcement of this summer's sabbatical, planning has continued to ensure a powerful renewal experience for both Steve and Trinity's congregation. The Sabbatical Team has discussed the timeline and key elements of congregational activities. While we will be expertly led by our wonderful church staff, there will be increased opportunities for leadership among congregation members and space to mirror Steve's sabbatical theme.

Steve will explore his God-given talents and interest in music as well as how mindfulness may play a more important role in his daily life. Through worship and other congregational activities, we will consider our own God -given talents, allowing us to chart an individual course for inspiration and reflection. This renewal period will be a time to focus on spiritual, theological, and recreational matters giving us fresh energy and insight to reflect and return to the work of the church when Steve returns in September.

Over the next several weeks, there will be opportunities to learn more from Steve about his plans through the Monday Message and an in-person gathering following outdoor worship.
