

Montreat Retreat 2023



The mountains were calling and our Trinity church family and guests answered the call in beautiful Montreat, NC. It was a special weekend of spiritual renewal, fellowship, and fun. This wonderful tradition has been part of our congregation for over 45 years.

This year, our guest speaker/preacher was the Reverend Lisle Gwynn-Garrity, an ordained Presbyterian minister and pastorist (Pastor+Artist) of Black Mountain. Lisle's theme, "A Place at the Table," explored what hospitality looks like and how we can flex empathy like a muscle. We dove into the story of a woman washing Jesus' feet with oil and tears (Luke 7:36-50). The spiritual gift of compassion and mercy enabled us to feel empathy and compassion for ourselves and others. Lisle integrated handson-art elements into the program. How well it fits with Trinity's statement of purpose, "All are Welcome."

In addition to our spiritually uplifting sessions, activities included Friday night Vespers, sing-along, hiking, golf, shopping, visiting with friends, and well-deserved rest. The weather was perfect - sunny, crisp, and colorful. On Saturday night, we had fun square dancing with Beth Gunn as our caller and the Crooked Pine band. On the Journey



Some of you have asked about my thoughts on the war in Israel and Gaza. Certainly, the horrific terrorist attacks by Hamas on Israel back in early October are unjustifiable and should be condemned. But this latest instance of violence in that region reflects complex and complicated dynamics that have festered for decades, even centuries. I fear this current conflict will be with us for a while.

Given that, here's what I can say about where I am at the moment:

- I condemn all forms of antisemitism and islamophobia.
- I lament the radicalization of any religion that wreaks havoc and perverts the true meaning of faith.
- I refute any mindset that embraces violence as the only answer.
- I pray that humanitarian aid reaches those who need it most.
- I support the right of all people Israelis and Palestinians to live safe, fulfilling lives.
- I acknowledge that I can always learn more.

I'm contemplating a church-wide initiative in the new year, similar to, "Doing the Work" a few years ago. Please let me know if you'd like to participate and/or if you have suggestions on what we can engage in, read, or watch. Thank you for praying. Thank you for caring. Thank you for leaning into what it means to be a follower of Jesus in a challenged and challenging world.



Gold Medal for Philip

We were fortunate to have Philip Blount speak at the College of Elders Dinner on September 17. He has been in great demand for speaking throughout North Carolina since his return from the 2023 Special Olympics World Games in Berlin, Germany, where he earned a gold medal for his performance in the shot-put. Philip shared his gold medal with the Elders and kindly answered a few questions from the audience. We learned the following details:

- Philip loves history and was interested to learn about the 1936 Berlin Olympic games when Hitler was in power and that Jesse Owens won 4 gold medals.
- He has been training for 15 years.
- Philip was also entered in the 100-meter sprint and the 4X100 team relay.
- Philip says the 4X100 team relay is his favorite because the team must work together to be successful.
- He put an eight pound shot and cleared 23 feet.

He did learn a few German words. "Mutter" and "Vater" and after the competition, "Bier!"

To close the evening, Philip shared the Special Olympics Oath and then asked the Elders to repeat after him: "Let me win, but if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt."
